Chairing the management board of an organisation is not allowed “when interest ended within past two years” (1# Institut français de la nutrition IFN). The NDA Panel was appointed in 2012 and he only left the board in 2011. Being the member of a scientific advisory board (2# Accorservices/Edenred) is also not allowed. Current or past consultancy (4 and 5# Institut National de la consommation - INC) is not allowed. Owning intellectual property rights (6# Patent) is not allowed.
