ANNEX – PERSONAL DATA PROCESSING IN THE CONTEXT OF DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST BY RECRUITMENT CANDIDATES

1. EFSA shall process all Declarations of Interest pursuant to Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 December 2000 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Community institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data.
2. The purpose of the data processing is to safeguard the independence of EFSA and its constituent bodies.
3. The legal basis for Declaration of Interests processing is provided in:
 - a. Article 11 and 11(a) of the Staff Regulations.
 - b. The Decision of the Executive Director implementing EFSA's Policy on Independence and Scientific Decision-Making Processes regarding Declarations of Interests, dated 21 February 2012, available on the EFSA website.
4. The EFSA Executive Director is the controller of handling the declarations of interest.
5. The nature of interests to be declared, the obligation to do so, as well as possible consequences of not declaring are explained in the relevant Decision of the Executive Director.
6. The recipients of the Declarations of Interest are the EFSA Human Capital and Knowledge Management Unit (HUCAP), the Executive Director as appointing authority, the Head of Department where the candidate will be assigned to and the Ethics Adviser (on a case-by-case basis). Furthermore, Declarations of Interest may be transferred to bodies in charge of a monitoring or inspection task in conformity with European Union Law, including the European Court of Auditors, the Internal Audit Service, OLAF, the European Ombudsman and the European Data Protection Supervisor.
7. The conservation period of Declarations of Interest is as follows:
 - a. Declarations related to recruited candidates for Temporary Agents (TA) and Contract Agents (CA) positions are kept in the agent's personal file, in accordance with Art. 26 of the Staff Regulations. Personal files are kept until 5 years after the jobholder has terminated employment at the agency, provided there are no pending claims or any other open issues concerning their EFSA employment relationship.
 - b. Declarations related to non-recruited TA, CA candidates will be deleted where possible when those data are not necessary for budgetary discharge, control and audit purposes at expiration of the 2 years retention period.
 - c. Declarations related to non-recruited TA, CA candidates entered on a reserve list are kept until the expiration of the reserve list.
